

## Connecting to shared folders on vet-ifs – Windows 10

If you are connected to eduroam you do not need Vet VPN. If you are off-site, e.g. at home, then you must first connect to Vet VPN before attempting to connect to the IFS share.

## Connecting to VetMed shared folders

- 1. Press the Windows Key (�) + R, or the Start button and search 'Run'
- 2. In the run dialogue box type in **\\ifs.vet.private.cam.ac.uk\Vetmed**

- 3. Click **OK.**
- 4. When prompted enter your username as CRSID@cam.ac.uk and your password is your Raven password.

## Disconnecting from the Vet IFS shared folders

- 1. You may need to disconnect the old Vet IFS Shared Drive.
- 2. Open File explorer and go to "This PC".
- 3. Right click on the shared drive
- 4. Select Disconnect from the drop-down menu.
